This pilot program will assist the Court and parties in processing cases more efficiently and assist in the ultimate development and implementation of electronic filing.

II. Briefs or documents submitted via e-mail are not a substitute for, but in addition to, the required paper filings, which constitute the official Court record.

III. Time and Form of Filing

By submitting the brief or document electronically the filer certifies that:

- a. All reasonable steps have been taken to ensure that the copy does not contain computer code, including viruses, that might be harmful to the court's electronic filing system and to other users of that system.
- b. The e-mail brief is a single, text-searchable PDF file, no more **larger** than **5 9 MB** in size, and is an exact duplicate of the paper copy. **If the size limitation is a problem contact the court and a CD can be submitted.**
- c. The attachment is transmitted within two weeks ~~after~~ **of** its paper counterpart **is being** filed with the court and is copied to the ~~all~~ other parties ~~in the case~~ **to the appeal.**
- d. The subject line of the e-mail includes the appellate case number and name.
- e. The attached file(s) follows the naming sequence: appellate case number, followed by the document type designation (as specified in section I above) and volume number, where appropriate. For example: D012345AOB.pdf (for an appellant's opening brief), D012345RB.pdf (respondent's brief), D012345ARB.pdf (reply brief), D012345RT1.pdf (volume one of a reporter's transcript), D012345CT2.pdf (volume two of a clerk's transcript), etc.
- f. The electronic brief or document is e-mailed to 4d1ebrief@jud.ca.gov and copied to all other parties in the case. The sent e-mail may be used as confirmation.
